



- No devices at meals or sleep time.
- Friend and follow your children on social media. But don't stalk them.
- Don't text and drive. Set the example. Your children will do what you do when they drive. Not what you say

- Protect them in an age appropriate way. Privacy needs grow as they get older.
- Remove photos and comments about them on social media when they ask you to.
- Ask them why they want to play an online game so long or use their phone again. Show them inspirational sports
 videos, cool music videos, educational animal and environment videos and YouTube tutorials for something
 they're interested in as an alternative to snapchat streaking, Instagram posting and more gaming.
- Choose for them sometimes. Lonely Planet or a good film might be a better choice than 5 episodes of Spongebob or Paw Patrol. (We still love you Spongebob!)
- Try not to get angry. Understand their sense of entitlement to devices. To them using devices is as natural as using the car, TV or fridge. You just need to help them find a balance.
- Kids and even teenagers know they need limits. Sit down, discuss and agree the family rules together- with age
 appropriate rules for each child, and rules for parents too.
- Easier said than done, try to be consistent. Have 'No Devices Days' and times and even 'Binge Days' but be consistent. It'll cause less stress in the long run.
- Ensure as much as you can that they cultivate other interests early on in music, sports, arts and social activities and that they stick at them so, as they grow up, going online isn't always the default.
- Lastly, simply go outside.

P3 overview of planned work for December

Mathematics: Counting in 1s, 2s, 3s 5s, 10s/ numbers before, after and between

up to 100. Adding a single digit number to a double digit up to 100. Adding 2/3 numbers horizontally and vertically. Read and spell number names to 20.

Continue to use coins for simple shopping activities **up to 20p** and giving change. Word problems relating to money. Parents are encouraged to engage children in real everyday shopping activities. Look at units of measurement - using cm and metres and non-arbitrary units ie spans, cubes to measure objects around the house.

<u>Literacy</u>: Pupils will learn how to lay out and write their own letter to Santa, sequence and write a recount of the story of Christmas, complete comprehensions related to Christmas theme and write instructions on how to make a Christmas decoration. They will complete seasonal acrostic poems. Pupils will look at the Advent calendar and answer questions about it. Grammar work will continue to focus on capital letters and full stops, speech marks and question marks and adding ing to a word. We will also look at a variety of stories and poems related to Christmas. <u>W.A.U</u>: Exploration of light and uses (in relation to Christmas lights and decorations)._Children will investigate how the earth moves round the sun to make day and night. Exploring Christmas traditions around the world. Children will design their own decorations.

P4 overview of planned work for December

<u>Literacy-</u> Pupils will know that adverbs are used to describe verbs. They will identify and use these in their written work and play games about adverbs. Continue to complete the LCSWC method for spellings. Pupils will be reading their shared text 'Hurricane' and picture book 'Flood' and will be carrying out activities based on these. In writing pupils will be learning about adventure stories and will be writing their own story based on the book 'The Tunnel'.

<u>Numeracy-</u> Pupils will be continuing to learn their multiplication tables focusing on their 3 times tables and revising their 2,5&10 times tables. Pupils will be solving word problems. Pupils will begin to multiply 2 digit numbers by 1 digit. Our topic work this month will cover time where we will be revising the times of o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. Pupils will be writing these in both analogue and digital. They will look at times to 5 minute intervals. We will be solving word problems related to time.

<u>World Around Us-</u> Pupils will continue the topic of 'Extreme Earth'. Pupils will look at the history of Pompeii. Pupils will know what causes earthquakes and how they are measured. Pupils will conduct volcano and rainbow experiments. Pupils will know what tsunamis are and will create safety posters. Pupils will carry out Christmas art and craft activities.

P5 overview of planned work for December

Numeracy: Number: Language of multiplication and division. Multiplying work (by 2, 3, 4, 5, & 10)

Topic: Position, movement and angle (grid references, coordinates and compass points)

Mental Maths – Multiplication of tables. Language of multiplication and division

Weekly tables test and mental maths test preparation, Learn rule for finding coordinates 'Over the hall and up the stairs',

Learn **rule** for compass points – 'Naughty elephants squirt water' (N, E, S, W)

Literacy: Novel: Complete Charlotte's Web Novel and related activities

Grammar work – Past tense work and revision of work covered to date, Proof reading exercises

Writing – Narrative writing – Retelling a story in their own words and creating an advertisement

P6 overview of planned work for December

<u>Maths</u> Number: Pupils will be able to solve problems involving addition and subtraction, know 2-12 times tables (group appropriate) and use these in solving simple problems.

<u>TOPIC:</u> Symmetry continued (Christmas symmetry), Pupils will know the 8 points of a compass and follow instructions involving these points (turning half turns, quarter turns etc.), Pupils will know that angles turn in multiples of 45 degrees (compass) and multiples of 30 degrees (clock).

<u>English</u>: Pupils will understand the use of speech marks and use them appropriately, the difference between direct and reported speech. Pupils will know the key elements of a recount and be able to write one and will recount 'The Nativity Story'.

<u>Topic/World Around Us</u> Pupils will complete 'Space' Power Points. Pupils will know the planets in our system. They will know what a constellation is and be aware of the legends connected with them.

Homework

We encourage the P6's to keep doing AR reading and Doodle Maths as part of their daily homework. Each pupil should be taking at least one AR test per week (more if on green and orange level) and working towards their word count target for the term.

Takeaway will continue for P6.

- AR Books can be changed in the library between 8.30 and 8.50.
- **ICT suite** is also available at these times to complete AR tests.

Trips: The P6 pupils will be having a Trip to Armagh Planetarium in January. More information will follow.

P7 overview of planned work for December
